The 2022 Birmingham Commonwealth Games is about to get under way. Eddie Ockenden, Kookaburras co-

captain, making his fourth Commonwealth Games appearance, has been awarded the privilege along with Squash athlete Rachael Grinham to co-carry the Australian Flag at the Opening Ceremony. The Commonwealth Games 2022 opening ceremony will begin on Friday at 05:00 AEST.

Friday 29 July is the first day of competition for Tasmanian Athletes with Jake Birtwhistle (Triathlon), Ariarne

Titmus (Swimming) and Georgia Baker & Josh Duffy (Cycling) leading the way. Tasmanian Athletes will be competing across all days of the Games competition until the closing ceremony on the 8 August.




