Stewart McSweyn grew up on Tasmania's small but picturesque, King Island. He boarded at Ballarat Clarendon College from Year 7 and in 2013 he ran the junior race at the IAAF World Cross Country Championships.

In Stewart's first year as a senior athlete (2015), he competed in the 5000m at the World University Games and won a bronze in the Australian Road Running Championships.

Stewart is currently ranked second on the Australian All Time Lists in the 1500m, 3000m, 2 miles and 5000m and first in the 10,000m.

Stewart is the current national record holder in the 10,000m and the indoor 1500m.

Stewart is one of Australia's most versatile athletes!
