Georgia Baker will compete in her second Olympics.

Prior to cycling Georgia was very active in a range of sports including swimming, netball, triathlon and taekwondo. Georgia was identified as a potential cyclist following testing held at her primary school and was then picked up by the Tasmanian Institute of Sport.

In 2011 and 2012 Georgia claimed back-to-back U19 World Titles as part of the team pursuit, these results highlighted her credentials as a future track star.

Georgia first raced in senior competition at the 2016 World Championships and debuted in her first Olympic Games in 2016.

At the 2019 UCI Track World Championships in Poland, Georgia teamed with Ashlee Ankudinoff, Alex Manly, Annette Edmondson and Amy Cure to win the team pursuit before winning silver with Cure in the Madison.
